Multimedia Presentation

- ★ This can be a PowerPoint, PhotoStory3, or DVD about your biome.
- Make sure you cover plants, animals, climate, landscape, human influence (good and bad), and resources.

Travel Brochure

- ★ Create a two-sided (six-panel) travel brochure about your biome. Use any appropriate Microsoft Publisher template.
- ★ Use pictures sparingly and appropriately.
- ★ Cite your sources.
- Sell your biome—why should somebody want to visit?

Journal Entries (Animal) ★ You are an animal travelling through your biome.

- ★ Be very specific about: ☐ the type of animal you are; ☐ the climate and location of your biome; ☐ how long you have been there and what changes to your environment you have witnessed; where you are on the food chain (what predators eat you, and what prey do you eat?);
- any interactions you have with humans (are humans a threat to your survival?). ★ Make sure that time passes between journal entries. (You might span an entire year, show-
- ing the changes in seasons in your biome through your entries.) ★ Each entry should be minimum 1/2 page typed and should include a picture (from the computer or drawn)—if you use pictures found on the Internet, cite your sources!
- ★ Make a clever cover for your journal.

Children's Book (Rock)

- ★ This may be done with a partner.
- ★ Create the character of a talking rock that has survived and witnessed all of the steps of primary succession.
- ★ Write and illustrate one page per step of primary succession.
- ★ Pictures can be drawn, computer generated, taken from the Internet (cite your sources), or a combination.
- ★ Make a clever cover and a surprising ending!
